When you need accurate technical information or advice, you go to a specialist. Might be your doctor, or lawyer, or an electrician, or plumber. You need and want someone who has education or technical training in the topic of interest. Information based on technical expertise provides accurate, objective assistance to help you determine what you need to know.

When it comes to fish and wildlife conservation issues, people often resort to their own experience, tradition, or rumor. Or people rely on what's discussed at the barber shop or coffee shop from unnamed experts commonly referred to as "they say".

But, North Dakota has a highly trained, professional Game and Fish Department that will give you science-based information on a wide variety of fish and wildlife issues. They are the specialists.
